


## **Prepare for Worship**

### **First Reading**

#### Acts 11:1–18

The apostles and brothers throughout Judea heard that the Gentiles had also received the word of God. <sup>2</sup>When Peter went up to Jerusalem, those who insisted on circumcision criticized him, <sup>3</sup>saying, "You went to visit men who were uncircumcised and ate with them!"

<sup>4</sup>So Peter began to explain everything to them, point by point. He said, <sup>5</sup>"I was in the city of Joppa praying, and in a trance I saw a vision in which an object like a large sheet was let down from heaven by its four corners. It came right to me. <sup>6</sup>When I inspected it very carefully, I saw four-footed animals of the earth, wild beasts, reptiles, and birds of the air. <sup>7</sup>I also heard a voice telling me, 'Get up, Peter! Kill and eat!' <sup>8</sup>"But I replied, 'Certainly not, Lord, for nothing impure or unclean has ever entered my mouth.'

<sup>9"</sup>A voice spoke from heaven a second time: 'What God has made clean, you must not continue to call unclean.' <sup>10</sup>This happened three times, and then everything was pulled up into heaven again. <sup>11"</sup>At that very moment, three men who had been sent to me from Caesarea arrived at the house where we were. <sup>12</sup>The Spirit told me to go with them without any hesitation. These six brothers also accompanied me, and we entered the man's house. <sup>13</sup>He told us how he saw an angel standing in his house and saying, 'Send to Joppa and call for Simon, the one called Peter. <sup>14</sup>He will speak words to you by which you and all your household will be saved.'

<sup>15</sup>"As I began to speak, the Holy Spirit came down on them, just as he came down on us at the beginning. <sup>16</sup>Then I remembered how the Lord had said, 'John baptized with water, but you will be baptized with the Holy Spirit.' <sup>17</sup>So if God gave them the same gift as he gave us when we believed in the Lord Jesus Christ, who was I to try to stand in God's way?"

<sup>18</sup>When they heard these things, they had no further objections, and they praised God, saying, "So then, God has granted repentance that results in life also to the Gentiles!"

### Second Reading

#### 1 Corinthians 13:1-13

If I speak in the tongues of men and of angels but do not have love, I have become a noisy gong or a clanging cymbal. <sup>2</sup>If I have the gift of prophecy and know all the mysteries and have all knowledge, and if I have all faith, so as to move mountains, but do not have love, I am nothing. <sup>3</sup>If I give away everything I own, and if I give up my body that I may be burned but do not have love, I gain nothing.

<sup>4</sup>Love is patient. Love is kind. Love does not envy. It does not brag. It is not arrogant. <sup>5</sup>It does not behave indecently. It is not selfish. It is not irritable. It does not keep a record of wrongs. <sup>6</sup>It does not rejoice over unrighteousness but rejoices with the truth. <sup>7</sup>It bears all things, believes all things, hopes all things, endures all things.


<sup>8</sup>Love never comes to an end. But if there are prophetic gifts, they will be done away with; if tongues, they will cease; if knowledge, it will be done away with. <sup>9</sup>For we know only in part, and we prophesy only in part, <sup>10</sup>but when that which is complete has come, that which is partial will be done away with. <sup>11</sup>When I was a child, I spoke like a child, I thought like a child, I reasoned like a child. When I became a man, I put away childish things. <sup>12</sup>Now we see indirectly using a mirror, but then we will see face to face. Now I know in part, but then I will know fully, just as I was fully known.

<sup>13</sup>So now these three remain: faith, hope, and love—and the greatest of these is love.






# Lord's Prayer
